Here is a heartfelt prayer for God's compassion in the face of trials which threaten to create despair. Here is a yearning for God's merciful companionship and blessing.

Trinity Lutheran Church is in a place of transition. We are in a WILDERNESS. No one "stays" in the wilderness...you "pass through" it on your way to somewhere else. The Israelites wandered for 40 years, Jesus spent 40 days and nights in a wilderness. It's an in-between place...the place where we often can't find a focus or even the words for what we're experiencing. The life of faith is a continual letting go, a process of handing over more and more of our selves, our agendas, our possessions—into the hands of God, the one who made heaven and earth.

The leaves of autumn symbolize this, as every fall they give what they have back to the tree, and then let go.

The liturgy of Holy Communion has a gracious gesture: "Lift up your hearts – We lift them to the Lord." This acknowledges a truth...that *what we have been given we cannot hold forever*. We give it up. We freely offer our heart, our life, to our God in faithful trust.

Faith accepts the example of our Savior who offered his life for our sustenance and who shows us, like the leaves, what it means to give up his life on a tree.

The wilderness journey isn't only about a dying, a giving up (*there is no faith, no blessing, no joy, if it all ends here*), but traveling through the wilderness is about a rising up, about receiving a new life, it is the realization that when we have "lost" it all, God gives what we need, freely as a gift. Yes! God knows the way out of the wilderness! God knows the way from death to new life.

Secretary's Report - September minutes were reviewed and approved.

Treasurer's Report - Proceeds from Lambeau are generating approximately \$400-\$500 each time. Net loss for Trinity is approximately \$7,000. After a lengthy discussion it was decided that a Congregational meeting will need to be held November 15th at 9:45 (between services) to ask the congregation to approve a dispersal of the funds from the foundation to support the current financial liability of the church through March. **A motion was made by Terry Howe that we move to ask the congregation for \$50,000 out of the foundation on November 15, the motion was seconded by Jeff Dorow. The motion passed.** Jean will inform the Trinity Foundation Trustees.

New Business

A letter from the Emergency Shelter was read thanking Trinity for sponsoring the golf outing and generating \$5,277.89 to the shelter. Of note: Jean wishes to thank some anonymous Trinity members for their "extra" donations of \$200.00 that then generated extra matching funds.

Trinity Lutheran church was mentioned several times in an article in *The Post-Crescent* for its work with Loaves and Fishes.

Chuck Dorn has resigned from the church council and has given his property committee information to Erick Jensen. His position on the council will be left vacant for now.

Trinity welcomes a new family to our fold - Charles and Laurie Bouzek, and their girls, Katie and Nikki. Their membership was officially approved by the council.

Terry brought up the necessity for measures to control the spread of the flu at Church. Pastor will make an announcement at church regarding the sharing of the peace and communion.

The time is fast approaching when many of the council members' terms will be up. It was stressed that the council will need some continuity of old members during this time at Trinity. Jean reports of the challenge in getting new people to join the council. Tom asks that we forward names of potential council members to him before the next executive meeting in November.

Trinity is hosting the warming shelter December 27-January 3. Kathy Kuck is the liaison person. Trinity supplies the supper and a light breakfast.

The meeting ended with prayer concerns and prayer led by Pastor Kurt.

GTZ TASK FORCE AT WORK



The Trinity representatives to the GTZ Strategic Planning Team would like to share the following information: a summary of the work completed by the team through its meeting on October 13th.

- The joint strategic planning team representing Grace, Trinity and Zion Lutheran Churches has now toured all 3 facilities in order to gain a better understanding of each congregation's mission.
- The team has developed a working draft Mission Statement that guides our joint ministry initiatives:
 - ▣ "Reaching out together to bring Hope, Faith and Love"
- We have also developed a Vision of what this joint ministry can become. We all agreed that:
 - ▣ We will develop a strong connection to the community, to not just be "in" the community, but to be a "part of" the community.
 - ▣ All 3 congregations are firmly committed to each other; committed to share in worship, work, celebration, the gains and the pains.
 - ▣ We will become a "Church Without Walls"; that is, we will not let our institutional expression be a barrier to bringing more people to a faith in Jesus that transcends Sunday worship and spills over into our weekday lives.
 - ▣ We will rejoice in dynamic pastoral leadership that is partnered with strong lay leadership.
 - ▣ We will be focused on building a future rather than saving a past.
- To fulfill the Mission and to make the Vision a reality, we agreed that our next steps will be to:
 - ▣ Develop a sustainable financial model for our ministry together.
 - ▣ Define who we want to reach and serve. Understanding the changing demographics and expectations of our congregations, our neighborhoods and our community.
 - ▣ Develop a strategic focus on ministries that will effectively meet the needs and the expectations of those we wish to serve.
 - ▣ Take a "hard look" at the staffing and the facilities needed to fulfill our ministry together.
- In the coming weeks we will be developing and recommending to our Church Councils strategic initiatives to get to work on each of these vital areas.
- While there are times when we feel somewhat overwhelmed, we are very excited about our future ministry together. We welcome your questions or suggestions.

NEWS FROM THE BALCONY



Thanks to the generosity of two anonymous families, Trinity's organ has had some major overhauling this summer. It was done by Christoff Wahl of the Wahl Organ Shop here in Appleton.

In order to tell you about what was done, it will be necessary to explain some organ "lingo." If you have never ventured up to the balcony to look at our instrument, you probably have only seen the view on the left: The pipes you can see are called the façade pipes, but there are many hundreds more out of sight behind them. All of the organ pipes are played by means of the console.

The console consists of 3 keyboards and a pedal board (a full keyboard but played with the feet) which each control a section of pipes called a division. The top keyboard or swell controls the "swell" division of pipes. The middle keyboard is called the great and the pipes it plays are the "great" division. These pipes are free standing, and are the ones you can see. The bottom keyboard, or choir controls the third division and the pedals have their own flock of pipes which are the longest and lowest sounding. Most of the pipes are behind the façade pipes.

The swell pipes are inside a box, called, surprisingly enough, the swell box. The front of the swell box has large shutters (or shades) that look like vertical venetian blinds. These can be opened and closed from the console, allowing the organist to control the volume of these pipes. This is an important feature, as you can't control the dynamics (loud and soft) on an organ as you do on a piano by pushing harder on the keys. The swell shades on our organ have been sickly for a long time, and finally had completely died.

The choir division pipes are also contained in a "box" with shades. These have never worked as long as I (Elizabeth) have been at Trinity.

The project involved removing quite a few pipes, and taking the mechanical workings to the Wahl shop for repair. During this time, the organ was always available for Sunday worship, although some parts of it were not working. Christoff left lots of post-it notes on the organ, so players would know what they could or could not use!

Now everything is back together and the expression pedals for both the choir and swell divisions are working. Hallelujah! Thanks be to God!

We are extremely grateful to our donors without whom this project would not have been possible. Thank you, thank you, thank you!
