DINNER CHURCH


Trinity loves food!

We have a long history of sharing food, serving food and eating food. We collect food for food pantries, schools and blessing boxes. We donate our time to various non-profits like Loaves & Fishes. And of course, we love our church picnics and potlucks. Food has been an important part of our congregation from our time beginning in the early 20th century.


It was no different for the Church in the first century. As we learned in our recent study of the book of Acts, the first followers of Jesus were often found breaking bread from house to house. They used Christ's model as they gathered the poor and the outcast around their tables of food to talk about Jesus.

This model of Dinner Church is making a comeback. Over 300 congregations in the US are transforming lives by inviting the unheard, the unchurched, the lonely to a table full of food.

Verlon Foster, author of *Welcome to Dinner, Church*, says that Revelation 3:20 makes it clear that Jesus still wants to have dinner with sinners and that Jesus wants us to set the table.



Here's one reason why Dinner Church is having such success, according to Foster. Dinner Church is accessible to the poor. In the past, our churches were built in middle and upper class locations - in neighborhoods that could afford our brick-and-mortar structures.



We assume that the poor would come to our buildings if they wanted to. Unfortunately, this line of thought has left us unprepared to reach "the least, the last, the lost, and the left-behind," the very ones Jesus first reached for when he was on earth.

Foster concludes that, Dinner churches "demonstrate a visible understanding of primary human needs. Their gatherings begin with abundant tables filled with free food and end with a sense of family that embraces the neighbors who are used to being ignored and shunned. To do a church for these isolated friends, in a nearby community center, and in a way that meets their physical and inclusion needs with a big family table, is a great thing."

Large portions of our downtown population — singles, the financially challenged, ethnic minorities and others — live in isolation. Many struggle to find healthy meals. Sadly, many of these people will never find their way into our Sunday worship service. In other words, there is great opportunity for fresh expressions of church here in Appleton.

I believe Trinity's love of food and love of Jesus make us a perfect congregation to start a Dinner Church in our downtown community.

What do you think? Should we give it a go?

Readings and studies for Wednesdays August include:






Blessing Box
